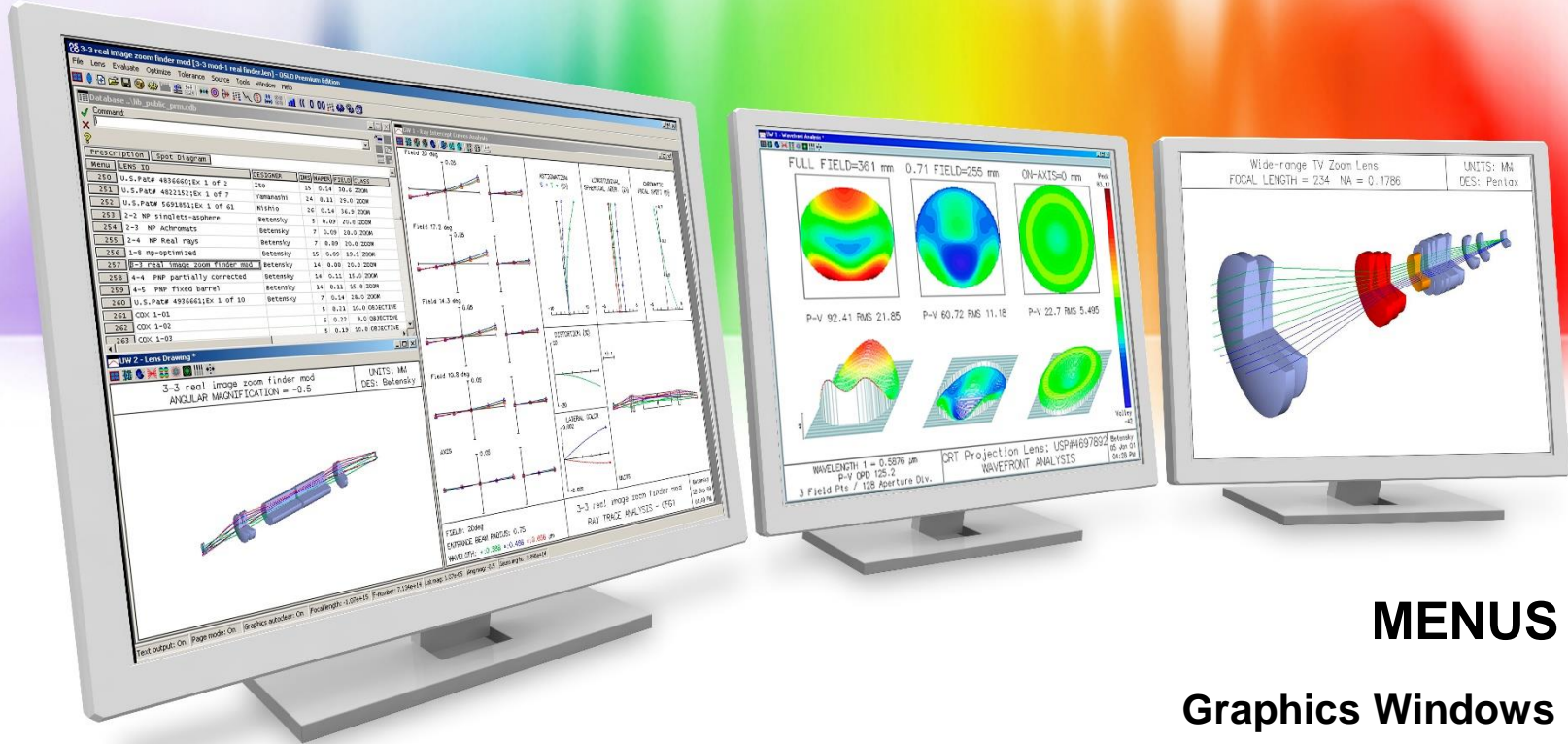

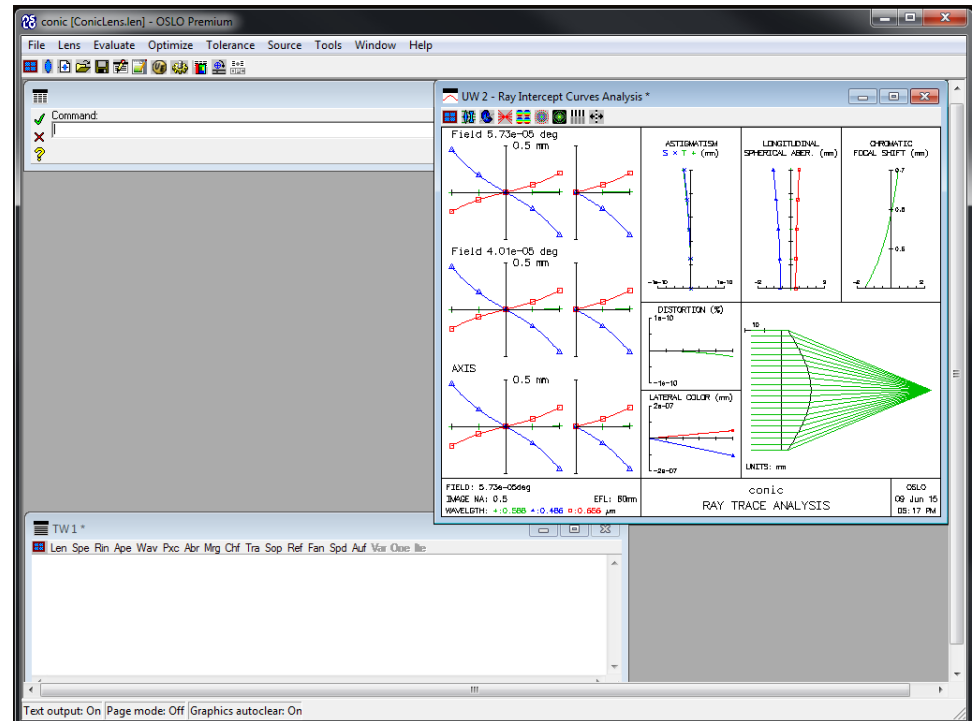

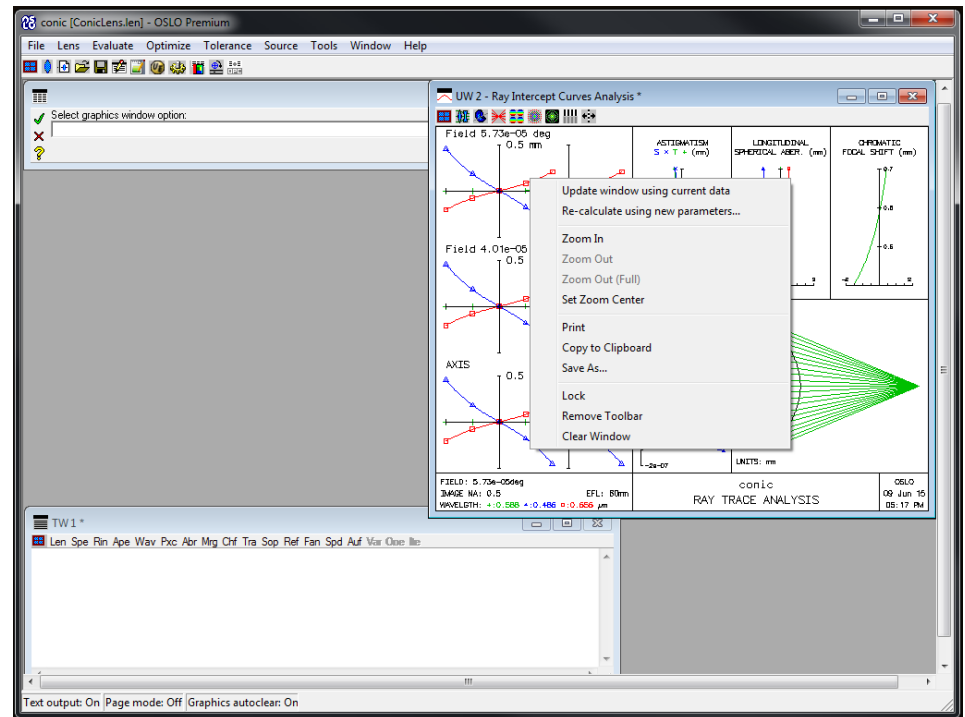
Graphics windows – basics

- The graphics window has been made larger for this video
- Configurable buttons on the top can be used to generate graphics
 - Many different options
- You must update the window when changes are made
 - Double left clicking is easiest
 - Right clicking can work too
- Multiple graphics windows can be open (up to 32)
 - “gwo” command
 - Window menu item



Graphics windows – a few more basics

- Right clicking opens up more options
 - Updating the window
 - Setting new parameters
 - Zooming in and out
 - Right-click options
 - Left-click and drag
 - Mouse wheel
 - Printing, copying to clipboard, and saving data
 - Lock the window
 - Clearing the window



Graphics windows – video tips and tricks

- Lots of fun preference options
 - “stp” sets preferences
 - Can also do under File menu
- Turn echo on
- Turned autoclear off to overlay graphics
- Right clicking, “clr”, or “gcl” commands
- Black background
 - Can also be done with preferences
- Graphics windows are flexible and configurable
